The Pastor's Letter

The council has gotten into the tradition of examining one of our core values at the start of each council meeting as our devotion time. We read the core value together, and then reflect on ways we are currently living out that value at Trinity. This week the core value we reflected on was Love. As a reminder, the way we explain that in our values statement is like this: "We believe that God is love. We believe that God loves everyone in the world. We share God's love for us by loving others. "In this is love, not that we loved God but that God loved us" (1 John 4:10)."

So, we read that, and then shared how we'd seen love lived out in our congregation. People shared examples of having their name lifted up during prayer time, and then receiving phone calls checking in on them. Or Levi's love of hugs. Or the love Woman's Co-op members show each other and us. There were so many warm images of how we try to live out love as a congregation. And then we jumped immediately from there into the adoption of the agenda, and it felt like an awkward transition.

It felt like an awkward transition, but, as I shared with the council, it's not. We do a lot of business at Trinity, and sometimes I wonder, worry even, if we lose track of the spiritual in the business. But the business is spiritual, if we know where to look. Our vision at Trinity is that we are "a gathering of God's people, anchored in the Post neighborhood, reflecting God's freeing power to our congregation, our neighborhood, and the wider community." This is vision, the purpose, that we sense God calling us into. So, when we are about the business of the church, as long as that business is helping us live more fully into that vision, into God's vision, it is God's work.

The work of the council is God's work. Council does a lot of business stuff. We go over finance reports, check in on property reports, try to create policies to keep us running smoothly, discuss upcoming events. An

outsider may hear a council meeting and think, how is this different from any other non-profit board of directors. But this business is about keeping Trinity on track so we can live into where we think God is leading us. Property team does property stuff. They fix lights, leaks, cut grass, manage disasters, and try to figure out what to do with the parking lot. All of this is essential to our vision, because we cannot be a gathering of God's people in the Post Addition without a place to gather. Mary sets up and cleans up after coffee hour every Sunday, the work of dishes is the work of hospitality. Wayne comes in on Saturdays to staple bulletins, imagine trying to worship if we just handed you a loose stack of paper and hoped you could keep them in the right order, or even had all the pages. Kathy organizes us in the CROP walk every year. Bob and Doug make sure our bills are paid, because it's important that we are good stewards of the gifts God has given us, which means not paying late or overdraft fees. As I write this, I'm emailing back and forth with the consultant JoAnn is working with to make sure our website doesn't crash. I could go on and name the work that each one of you is doing, but Connie (Minutes! Connie keeps the best minutes!) already mentioned the Trumpet is going to be long this month, so I'll cut it short. The point is the business of the church can be nothing other than business if we lose sight of its purpose. But if we let our purpose shape our work, then this business becomes God's business.

So, as you're on the lookout for God sightings this week, I invite you to look in the unexpected busy work of your day. In the church yes, but also in your life. Have a doctor's appointment? You may see God. God wants for you to be a good steward of your health, so good job keeping up on taking care of yourself. Paying household bills, how is God glorified in that work? Cleaning your house, can you find prayer in the repetition.

God is in our work, dear people of God. If we only know how to see.

ELCA Social Statement on Civic Life and Faith

We live in an increasingly polarized society, with a lot of noise all around us about what it means to be people of faith in our nation. Jesus spoke of being "in the world but not of the world," so as Christians should we be above politics? Or should we be deeply involved in politics? Are Christians supposed to be from a particular political party and/or is your faith less than if you are part of whatever the opposing party is? The ELCA is working on a draft social statement called Civic Life and Faith to help us ask those questions. Social Statements, as a piece of information, are writings from the church that provide broad frameworks to assist us in thinking about and discussing social issues in the context of faith and life. The Social Statement on Civic Life and Faith is still in draft form, it will not be approved until the 2025 Churchwide Assembly. RECIPE CORNER

InstaPot Chicken and Dumplings

If you have an InstaPot/Pressure Cooker, this is super yummy and became a favorite the first time we had it. I increase it by half (amounts in parenthesis) to have enough to feed a larger group or have leftovers.

Ingredients:

- 2 (3)T Butter
- 2 (3) C. Chopped Onions (I actually use less, it depends on how much you like onions)
- 1 (1 ½) C Chopped Celery
- 1 (1 ½) C. Chopped Carrots
- 1 (1 ½) tsp Poultry Seasoning
- 1/2 (3/4) tsp Salt

Pepper to taste

- 2 (3) C. Chicken Broth
- 1/2 (3/4) C. Cream
- 1 5 (8) Count Package of Pillsbury Buttermilk Grands Biscuits (Southern Homestyle)
- 1 (1 ½) Lb Chicken (breast, tenders or thighs) cut into 1" Chunks
 - Sauté on normal onions, seasoning, salt & butter for 6-8 minutes stirring often.
 - Cancel
 - Add celery, carrots, chicken & broth, stir.
 - Manual pressure for 2 minutes, quick release.
 - Cancel
 - Return to sauté on normal. Add cream, stir. Add biscuits each cut into 1/8s being sure to add them individually. Stir
 - Cook 4-6 minutes or longer until biscuits cook and the sauce thickens, stir often.
