# The Pastor's Letter

Dear Trinity,

Last Sunday we started our journey to Christmas with Jesus talking about people fainting in fear. This Sunday we will meet John the Baptist, who next Sunday will call us all a "brood of vipers" fleeing "from the wrath to come." All around us the world is decked in lights and bows, Christmas carols wafting through store speakers and car radios, yet right here in our church we are singing songs about stars falling from the sky while a crazed man with locusts in his teeth calls us names. Why is it that in the season dedicated to celebrating Christ's birth, the church finds itself so out of step with culture?

We are out of step with culture because culture's understanding of Christmas is simply too small. As Christians, we proclaim that the God who became flesh and dwelt among us in human form on Christmas is not only a past event, but Christ is present in our world today and in our unfolding future. We proclaim the Christ "who was, who is, and who is to come." In Advent, we anticipate not the historical birth of an infant, we anticipate the continued promise that God continually comes to bring life to a dying world.

In the northern hemisphere, our celebration of Advent matches the season of the year. As the days shorten and the darkness lengthens, we await the birth of the One who is the Light and the Life of the world. The Advent wreath creates a visual representation of this pattern. As the darkness grows outside, the lights of the Advent wreath increase, reminding us of Christ who is the Light that breaks the darkness.

Our readings help remind us that we are not waiting for baby Jesus to be born; we are waiting for God to come into our world. The first Sunday's readings urge us to be ready when God arrives and promises the glory of that day. The second and third Sundays tell of John the Baptist, his urging that we be prepared and his preachings on the hope Christ brings. The fourth Sunday's readings finally lead us into the birth narratives, and the form our promised hope will take, in the infant Jesus.

The color of the Advent season is blue. It is similar to the purple of Lent, but while purple has a penitential tone, blue represents hope and waiting.

It has been suggested that the idea of Advent has passed, and churches would do best to join with culture's celebration of Christmas rather than to fight it. I disagree with this suggestion. I think especially as Christmas becomes more and more commercial, the church is called to be grounded in the promise that Christ is bigger than our history and to create space and time to wait and to hope in God's promise of salvation.

**Extra Holiday Fun Fact:** Have you ever wondered about the phrase "Merry Xmas"? It comes from the Greek spelling of Christ, Χρίστός. You can see another example of this shorthand on our Christmas tree in the sanctuary. Look for an ornament with a P over an X. It is known as the Chi Ro, the first two letters of the word Christ in the Greek alphabet.

# **RECIPE CORNER**

# **Ribbon Jello**

Ingredients:

5 boxes of Jello (I use sugar free) Sour Cream Boiling Water



Dissolve a box of Jello in 1 C. of boiling water.

Transfer <sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub> of fully dissolved jello back to the measuring cup.

Add  $\frac{1}{2}$  C. of sour cream to the  $\frac{1}{2}$  C. of jello remaining in the bowl. Whisk to fully combine the two.

Pour the clear jello into the bottom of a 10" x 10" square pan. Place in the refrigerator and allow to set.

After the clear layer is set, pour the sour cream mixture over it and allow it to set.

Repeat for the other 4 boxes of Jello. Allow time for the Jello to cool down before pouring the clear layer, otherwise it may make a hole in the previous layer.

Serve by cutting into cubes or rectangular prisms. (Who said you would never need your geometry class???)

Use 3 red, 2 green at Christmas, harvest colors at Thanksgiving.
