#### **Pastor Letter**

March 2025

Dear Trinity,

Hard to believe this is my final pastor letter to you. I knew this day would come, it is the nature of pastoral ministry to move on and of congregational ministry to welcome new leadership and new ideas. And I truly feel the Holy Spirit calling me into this new role in the synod, where I can use all the incredible learnings that we figured out together to share with the whole synod. But it is still so bittersweet to be saying goodbye to all of you, and to this mission we have shared together for the last ten+ years. As the verse I shared at the start of my resignation letter stated, I truly do and will "thank my God every time I remember you... [and] I am confident of this, that the one who began a good work among you will bring it to completion by the day of Jesus Christ," (Philippians 1:3, 6). One of the nice pieces of this transition is that I will get to continue to see that good work unfolding and support the work, just from a different vantage point.

Transitions are hard, saying goodbye is hard. I was so grateful for Jeff's words during worship a few weeks ago about the emotions of grief. I am feeling many of the emotions Jeff mentioned as I consider how our relationships are changing from pastor and people to DEM and congregation. I want to, like Peter in the text from Transfiguration Sunday, cling a little bit longer to the mountain top together, rather than descending into the work that God has before us. In times of ending, I have often found myself drawn to, of all unlikely places, the end of the book of Deuteronomy.

Deuteronomy, for those not familiar with it, is a series of speeches from Moses to the Israelites, outlining and commenting on the various laws God has given the people, and encouraging them to be faithful to God. Deuteronomy ends with Moses standing on the top of Mount Nebo,

overlooking the Promised Land across the River Jordan, which his people will soon enter into without him. He led them as far as he could, it was time for someone new to take the reins.

In Moses' final words, he encouraged Israel to "choose life," (Deuteronomy 30:19b). The use of the word "choose" here is an interesting one, because the Old Testament doesn't offer humanity a whole lot of choices, usually God does the choosing. But in Deuteronomy, God through Moses gives the Israelites the option to choose life, to choose loving God, obeying God, holding fast to God, and following God through whatever comes. This choice, the passage hints, will shape an uncertain future. And, the point should be made, the Israelites have the option to choose because God has already chosen them. This is not a way for them to become the people of God, that has already happened. This is an offer within their existing relationship with God. What they choose will shape their future, but it won't shape God's love, connection, and presence with them.

I have found this passage, this image, helpful in times of transition because it reminds me that there is a season for our work. We have journeyed well together for the season of these past ten years. Like Moses and the Israelites, we have had joys and struggles, we have overcome huge obstacles and fought over cucumbers, we have laughed and cried, been bored and elated, messed up and asked for forgiveness. We have lived. We did not finish the work, for the work cannot ever be finished, but we did our part together. And now we stand at a shift. We don't know what the future holds, and there is much we cannot choose. But we can choose life, we can choose trust, we can choose God, because God has already chosen us. And so, we journey into uncertainty, confident that God journeys ahead.

Blessings to you on your journey, dear people of God. I will be praying for you and cheering you on from the synod office.

These collaborations provide great assistance to Trinity as we secure necessary preaching and leadership through Lent.

Following Easter, Pastor Cheri will continue her alternate week preaching schedule on May 4<sup>th</sup>. The Council will review resources for supply preachers on alternate weeks.




# **Pastor Kjersten's Celebration**

# **RECIPE CORNER**"YUMMO" Chicken

# Ingredients:

- Boneless, skinless chicken thighs, tenderloins or breasts.
- Sour Cream flavored with garlic powder (about 1 tablespoon), I've started adding crushed garlic too (1-2 teaspoons, whatever tastes best to you)
- Crushed Ritz Crackers (for a gluten free alternative, use Japanese Panko)
- Melted Butter

## **Directions:**

- 1. Heat oven to 425 degrees.
- 2. Prepare sour cream mixture
- 3. Dredge chicken in sour cream mixture, roll in crackers.
- 4. Drizzle with melted butter (up to 1 stick)
- 5. Bake for 40 45 minutes on a cookie sheet covered with parchment paper, covering with aluminum foil the last 20-25 minutes.
- 6. Yummy served with a side salad.
